



## Homework






### Overall learning aims of this teaching sequence.

- to compose poetry in response to visual imagery, story and known poems



## Mathematics

In Mathematics this term, our topic is Numbers to 1,000. This covers numbers up to 1,000 and focuses on the value of each digit: place value. Pupils will learn how to compose and decompose numbers, compare, order and look for patterns.
