Genre Features – Persuasive Text

- Modality used to indicate the degree to which something is certain, possible or improbable. e.g. tends to, would, must
- ☐ **Emotive language** Using language to tap into a reader's emotions which helps to manipulate their opinion by pulling on their heartstrings. *e.g. defiantly, pride, tragic, betrayed*
- Rhetorical questions Rhetorical questions are questions that do not expect an answer. A rhetorical question is a question asked to make a point, rather than get an answer. e.g. What were they thinking?

Vocabulary

Expedition - A journey undertaken by a group of people with a particular purpose, especially that of exploration, research, or war.

Mongrel - A dog of no definable type or breed.

Greenheart – A South

American evergreen tree of the laurel family, yielding hard greenish timber which is used for marine work because of its resistance to marine bore.

Keel - The lengthwise timber or steel structure along the base of a ship, supporting the framework of the whole, in some vessels extended downwards as a ridge to increase stability.

Insubordination - Defiance of authority; refusal to obey orders.

Laborious - Requiring considerable time and effort.

Hummocks - A hump or ridge in an ice field.

Frostbite - injury to body tissues caused by exposure to extreme cold, typically affecting the nose, fingers, or toes.
