

Science

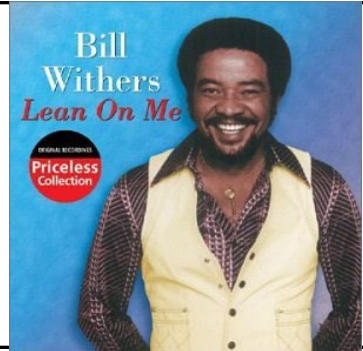

- Dividing 1 or 2 digit numbers by 10 and 100

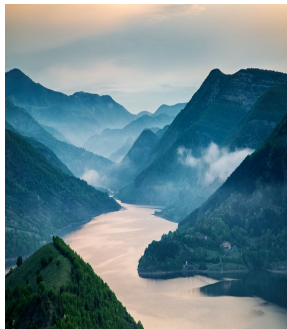

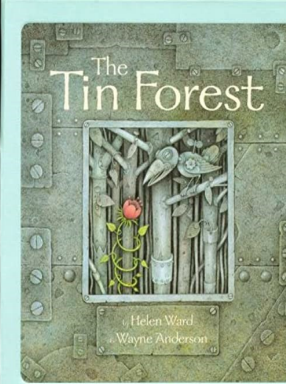
Topic

English

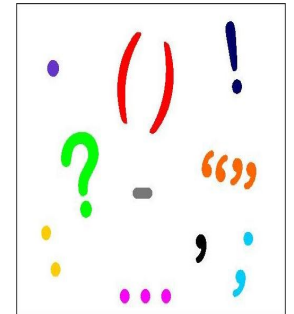


In English we will be exploring 'Tin Forest' by Helen Ward and Wayne Anderson. We will be learning about interpreting illustrations, describing settings and writing in role as a character, using descriptive language features (expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbial, alliteration, repetition, extended sentences, adverbial phrases). This will include writing diaries, descriptions, letters and recounts. We will be focusing on cursive handwriting and punctuation use/variety.

SPAG

The term we will be focusing on determiners, word families, prepositions, inverted commas and use of tense.

We will also be reminding children of their foundation grammar skills such as; Capital letters, full stops and word types.



RE
