SPaG Focus

- Proper nouns A proper noun is a specific name for a particular person, place, or thing. It always begins with a capital letter.
- □ **Common nouns** a common noun is not capitalised unless it either begins a sentence or appears in a title.
- □ Abstract Nouns naming words that you cannot see, smell, touch or perceive by any of your five senses.
- □ **Suffix (adding –ness)** Suffixes are strings of letters that are added to the end of words to alter and change their meanings. For instance, when –ness is added to an adjective it becomes a noun.
- **Consonants** a speech sound that is not a vowel.
- □ Vowels- one of the two groups of letters in the English alphabet. There are five vowels: a. e, I, o, and u.

Genre Features – Fiction

- Prediction A prediction is a statement that someone makes about what they think is going to happen.
- □ **Inference** a conclusion reached on the basis of evidence and reasoning.
- □ Scanning- look at all parts of something carefully in order to detect some feature.
- □ **Summarising -** give a brief statement of the main points of something.
- Questions and statement sentences Answering questions by stating facts.

Vocabulary

<u>Announcement</u>- a public or formal statement.

Awful- extremely bad or unpleasant.

<u>Chess</u>- one of the oldest and most popular board games. It is played by two opponents on a checkered board with specially designed pieces of contrasting colours, commonly white and black.

<u>Crossword puzzle</u>- a puzzle consisting of a grid of squares and blanks into which words crossing vertically and horizontally are written according to clues.

Ear- splitting- extremely loud.

Fidgety- restless or uneasy.

<u>**Pickled</u>**- food preserved in vinegar or salt water.</u>

<u>Practise</u>- perform (an activity) or exercise (a skill) repeatedly.

<u>**Trumpet</u>**- a brass musical instrument with a flared bell and a bright, penetrating tone.</u>

<u>**Tune</u>-** a series of pleasing musical tones.</u>

Weird- something strange or odd; puzzlingly unusual.

<u>Wrinkled</u>- a crease or ridge on a normally flat surface such as cloth or skin.
