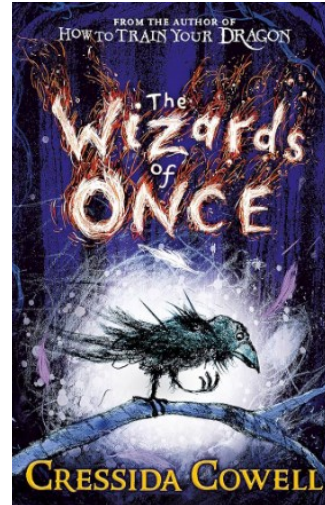


# Year 5 Term 2 Curriculum Booklet

## English

**Based on these texts the children will be exploring:**

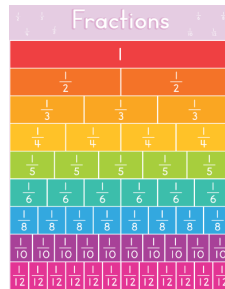
- Sentence structure

## Wider Curriculum: Science & History

This term our Science Kapow topic is ‘**properties and changes**’ where we will be able to: Determine the hardness, transparency, thermal and conductivity of different materials and link this to their uses as well as demonstrate, identify and describe reversible and irreversible changes.

Our History Kapow topic is “**What was life like in Tudor England?**” where we will be looking at how Henry the VIII’s rule affected England.

## Music

Our Kapow topic this term focuses on “**The blues**”. We will be looking at the history of this style of music, the Blues scale and how to improvise with notes from the Blues scale.



## PE

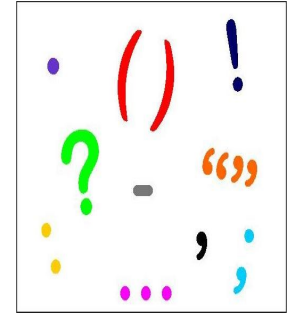
## Basic Knowledge

This term, the children will be expected to continue to practice their times tables, recap previous maths knowledge as well as spellings and vocabulary.

## SPAG

This term we will include:

- Adverbs
- Modal verbs
- Verb prefixes
- Standard English verbs
- Using inverted commas



## RE

In RE, Year 5 will be learning about **Incarnation: Was Jesus the Messiah?**

Children will be exploring how to:

- Explain the place of Incarnation and Messiah within the ‘big story’ of the Bible.
- Identify Gospel and prophecy texts, using technical terms.
- Explain connections between biblical texts, Incarnation and Messiah, using theological terms.
- Show how Christians put their beliefs about Jesus’ incarnation into practice in different ways in celebrating Christmas.
- Comment on how the idea that Jesus is the Messiah makes sense in the wider story of the Bible.
- Weigh up how far the idea that Jesus is the Messiah — a Saviour from God — is important in the world today and, if it is true, what difference that might make in people’s lives.
